OSHA HAZWOPER Training Regulations 29 CFR 1910.120 (q)

Emergency response to hazardous substance releases consists of: (1) First responder awareness level, (2) First responder operations level, (3) Hazardous materials technician, and (4) Hazardous materials supervisory level. Annual updates required to maintain certification.

HAZWOPER 40 hour Initial Training (4 or 5 days)

This course is designed to fully comply with all regulatory standards and is tailored to the specific needs of your operations (e.g. focused emergency response). HAZWOPER provides knowledge and skills necessary to assist with remedial operations surrounding a hazardous materials incident and utilizes a combination of classroom presentation and "hands-on" table top exercises.

Training is typically at the Technician level, and typically will cover subjects such as hazard assessment, scene management, spill control and containment, basic chemistry and toxicology, personal protective equipment (PPE) selection and use, respiratory protection, decontamination and scene monitoring. A study guide has been developed to supplement the course. A hands on exercise event can be included in this course. Students will also be briefed on OSHA, DOT and EPA federal regulatory changes. Each student must complete the written test and hands on exercise portion of the training to receive certification.

The 40-hr. HAZWOPER Training meets the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120(e)(8) and non-mandatory Appendix E (*Final Rule dated August 22, 1994*). EPA 165.5 (40-Hr HAZWOPER)

8-Hour HAZWOPER Supervisory Training

Prerequisite is 40- hr. Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response training

OSHA regulations (29 CFR 1910.120(e)(4) require that on-site management and supervisors directly responsible for, or who supervise employees engaged in, hazardous waste operations, receive at least eight additional hours of specialized training at the time of job assignment on such topics as, but not limited to, the employer's safety and health program and the associated employee training program, personal protective equipment program, spill containment program, and health hazard monitoring procedure and techniques. This program can help to meet these requirements when given in conjunction with site-specific or on-the job training for supervisors in the field.

OSHA 24-hr HAZWOPER Occasional Site Worker

Should I Take the 24 or 40 hour HAZWOPER?: Per OSHA's Interpretations: "Workers, such as equipment services worker, utility workers, etc., who must perform duties at a hazardous waste site, do fall under the scope of 29 CFR 1910.120. These workers must work under the direction of an on-site supervisor and a site-specific safety and health plan, and must be fully trained and protected pursuant to the HAZWOPER standard. When additional information becomes available through site characterization which verifies that there is minimal or no risk of employee exposure to hazardous substances, a lesser degree of PPE and worker training may be acceptable. **This course fulfills the requirements for certification under 29 CFR, Part 1910.120 (e) as an Occasional Site Worker.**

NOTE Employees who have duties related to handling or cleaning up hazardous materials or wasted in any of these function must take the 40-hour HAZWOPER course. The 24-hour course is designed for "Occasional Site Workers" meaning those individuals who ARE NOT required them to handle waste or hazardous materials as part of their job functions.

HAZWOPER Annual Refresher 8 Hour

This course meets the requirements in OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120 for eight hours of annual refresher training for workers at hazardous waste sites. Topics include update of HAZWOPER, OSHA, DOT, and EPA regulations, safety and health plans, hazardous chemicals, safety hazards, air monitoring, medical surveillance, site control, decontamination, personal protective equipment, and respiratory equipment. Students will critique incidents that occurred in the past year to assure proper procedures were followed and corrections made.
